ABOUT RICHARD

Born and raised in the UK, I was a chef before finding wine. I love cooking, I love food and I love working with my hands which is why I became a chef. I worked for two years as one before I enthusiastically got sucked into the wine scene. To immerse myself in the wide world of wine, I worked harvests in California, Chile, Bordeaux, Hungary and Germany before settling in South Africa in 1999.

I passed my Master of Wine exam on Sept 5th, 2011; I am one of a handful of Masters of Wine who actively makes wine and the only one who makes wine in South Africa.

Kershaw Wines began as an entity in 2012; starting with Chardonnay and Syrah and in 2015 Pinot Noir joined the fray.

In November 2021, I joined the Cape Winemakers Guild, which is an invitational membership of passionate winemakers who have played a pioneering role in the South African wine industry and who have excelled in their field.

When not in the cellar, I judge wine in competitions around the globe and am part of the educational panel for the Institute of Masters of Wine, and lecture for the WSET in South Africa.

WINEMAKING PHILOSOPHY

As a person who likes detail and a bit of nerdy and geekiness, I like to drill down into the smallest quirkeries and metrics that we face in winemaking.

My philosophy is not so much a rubric. It's more that I try to make wines that reflect the sense of place, making them in a way that is non-interventionist; it's to try and mirror those qualities in the glass.

The emphasis has to be on the vineyard first, but I truly believe that the maturation cycle plays a proportionately important role. Equally, whilst winemaking itself is crucial during the first 30 days of the wine's life, it's important to steer it correctly, as there are many facets requiring attention during the entire maturation cycle to prevent the wine from veering off track.

When we pick the grapes in the harvesting period, we pick according to the clone and the soil type, and we match the soils and the clones to each of the barrels.







In order to bolster these regional credentials, my personal mandate has been to prove Elgin has both a signature grape that is synonymous with the region as well as particular `terroirs'/meso-climates within its demarcated boundary that reflect regional distinctions.

To fully comprehend this, it is, therefore, necessary to dig deeper into the nuances/DNA that makes up our region. To initiate this, I have decided to make these wines that have been selected from a sub-region of Elgin from a specific vineyard and an individual clone. A barrel made of each, the idea behind these wines was not necessarily to sell them, but to deepen my understanding of how specific clones on specific soil type develop in barrels from specific barrel coopers.



THE SMUGGLER'S BOOT

The Smuggler's Boot wines were first released in 2014. The name derives from the time of trade embargoes in South Africa when growers & winemakers smuggled grapevine material into the country by hiding the cuttings in Wellington boots.

These are from interesting blocks of vineyards that were unknowns, often quite young, new blocks taken on for the first time and piqued my interest. They became my experimental range.

All small volumes, they are often matured in eggs, ceramics or amphoras. Something a bit different as we play around with these wines.









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
